of the porch at each story, and the first story also contains a fixed twelve-panel window. The west elevation contains pairs of twelve-over-one windows at the left and right sides of the first story. A single twelve-over-one window is located at the second story. Three twelve-over-one windows are located in the attic. At this elevation, the stucco exterior of the first story is seen below the wood shingled second story. The gable roof contains a plain, wide wood cornice. At the north elevation, the center section projects and contains a cross gable. The first and second stories, as well as the attic, contain pairs of twelve-over-one windows. The attic windows are not as tall as those in the first and second story. A door is situated at the left corner of the elevation. At the far left of the elevation, wood stairs lead up to the flat roof of a first story wing.

received a fellowship to study abroad (Archives). She discovered a rare plant in Oberlin, the 'Pithophora Kewensis,' a Chlorophyta/Green Algae, only found in South America and England's Kew Gardens (Oberlin News). Other residents were Clara Greene, Mathilda Irwin, Mrs. W.B. Fenn & John Frazer (City Directory). Eva Gulde, matron of Gulde house, moved into the house around 1935 (City Directory, Hi-O-Hi). Ellen B. Hatch taught physical education at OC & lived here c. 1939-42. Residents in the 1950s were Howard Robinson & Elizabeth Comings. In 1961 Prof. of French & Italian, Bernard Garniez & his wife, Prof. Nancy Caballero Garniez, who taught piano at the Conservatory, lived here (Hi-O-Hi). Another resident at this time was Josephine Vincent Cowin, a widow & assistant in the Conservatory's registrar office. Cowin retired in 1966; she had been married to Lewis Gilbert of the School of Theology & missionary to China (Archives).
