excellence with religious principles; it was named for Wilder in 1956. Men's Hall provided housing for 65 undergraduate leaders (class officers, athletic captains, publication editors, etc.) a dining room, a barbershop and other spaces for meetings and assembly (Blodgett). Today it serves as the student union and provides space for student organization offices, dining options, mailroom, and meeting and performance space along with places for social gatherings, relaxation and conviviality.

Wilder Hall was listed on the National Register as part of the Oberlin College thematic nomination in 1978. It was listed by the City of Oberlin as an Oberlin City Landmark in November of 1997.
