ON THE EVE OF THE CIVIL WAR, Sara Lucy Bagby, a runaway slave, escaped to Cleveland on the Underground Railroad. Not long after arriving, she was arrested. She became one of the last people to be tried under the federal Fugitive Slave Act of 1850, amidst protests from anti-slavery activists, many from nearby Oberlin (a hotbed of abolitionism at the time). Kulture Kids' Artistic Director Robin Pease, with help from community members and the audience, brings the story of Sara Lucy Bagby to life.
