## **Exterior Painting and Historic Color for Your Older Home**

Popular “old house” workshop presenter, Sara Hobbs, who is the Associate Director of Heritage Partner Development for the Cleveland Restoration Society and Field Representative for the national Trust for Historic Preservation will return to Oberlin on **Tuesday, April 28** at 7 p.m. at the Oberlin Public Library. She’ll be talking about the best way to repaint your older home with an appealing and historically accurate color scheme. Learn how to avoid paint failure with proper surface preparation, why manufactured siding is not a solution to paint problems, and what to look for when hiring a painting contractor. ## **Oberlin History Walks**

Put on your walking shoes and bask in the spring sunshine on one of the Heritage Center’s history walks. There are two offerings to enjoy:

**Tappan Square History Walk** provides a tour of the history and architecture around the square every 1<sup>st</sup> Friday and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday at 11:00 a.m. from May through October. Register for our next walks coming up on **Friday, May 1** and **Saturday, May 16**. The cost is \$6 per person with advance paid reservation or \$8 per person on the day of the tour. There is a \$1 discount for Oberlin Heritage Center members. This walk begins at the flagpole on the southeast corner of Tappan Square, Main and College Streets.

**Freedom’s Friends: Underground Railroad and Abolitionist History Walk** showcases Oberlin’s important role in the history of abolition and the Underground. It is offered at 11:00 a.m. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month from May through October. During its initial launch in the months of May and June, Oberlin Heritage Center members are invited to take this tour free of charge. Non-members’ tour fee is \$6 per person with advance paid reservation or \$8 per person on the day of the tour. Upcoming walks will be offered on **Friday, May 8** and **Saturday, May 23**. The walk begins on the northwest corner of Vine and Pleasant Streets, in Martin Luther King, Jr. Park.

Each history walk lasts approximately one hour and is given by a trained docent who shares stories and historic photographs. Walks may be cancelled and refunds will be made if fewer than five pre-register or if it is raining at tour time. Each walk is limited to 20 people.
