Part of camp will include a hands-on visit to the letter press studio of Special Collections at the Oberlin College library.

mask, examine objects of Greece, and go on an odyssey
of tales of gods and glory. Together we'll explore this

Oberlin Heritage Center camps are open to boys and girls ages 8 to 13. Each two-day camp runs from 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day. Camps are designed to stimulate children's creativity and whet their appetites for history, architecture, art, and the tastes and sounds of other cultures and other times. Camp will be held at the **Oberlin Depot at 240 South Main Street**, sometimes with walking field trips to interesting places nearby, weather permitting. For all days children should bring a bag lunch and dress for being outside for certain activities. Simple snacks are provided.
