




Legends and Innovations! Spring Break Camps 2012


Legends, Tales and History

Oberlin Heritage Center camps are designed to stimulate children's creativity and whet their appetites for history, architecture, art, and the tastes and sounds of other cultures and other times. Camp will be held at the **Oberlin Depot at 240 South Main Street**, sometimes with walking field trips to interesting places nearby, weather permitting. For all days children should bring a bag lunch and dress for being outside for certain activities. Simple snacks are provided.
